Our prestigious **National Academy of Sciences (NAS)** (www.nasonline.org) recently issued reports http://www.ucusa.org/news/press_release/national-academy-of-sciences-0394.html confirming that human activity from the emission of greenhouse gases is profoundly altering the earth's climate, and that we would be wise to reduce our climate pollution impact as well as begin preparing for changes in the climate that have already been set in motion.
